**Talk about it (before the film)**

What does the word ‘prejudice’ mean? In what ways can people experience prejudice towards them?

**Talk about it (after the film)**

- What do Judy and Nick think of one another when they first met? How and why do they change their minds?
- The city of Zootopia is home to all sorts of different ecosystems and animals. How many can you remember? Did the personalities of any of the animals surprise you?
- In what ways was the city designed to allow all of the animals to live together and be themselves? Why did this not always work?
- What is it about Judy’s press conference that so upsets Wilde and causes Judy to resign from the police? Does anything about Judy’s speech remind you of Deputy Mayor Bellwether’s secret plans?
- Why is it important to have an understanding of cultures different from our own? What can we all gain from learning about each other in this way?
