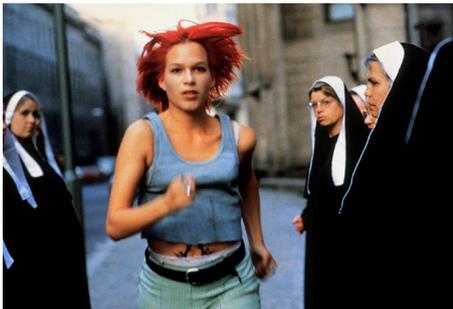

Victoria finds herself attracted to Sonne, and despite needing to leave for work she agrees to help when trouble unexpectedly arises. Suddenly in over her head, the consequences of Victoria's spur-of-the-moment decisions mount up. Shot in just a single take, this is a breathtaking thriller.

Talk about it

Can you think of any other films that feature a long take? What do filmmakers achieve by using this technique?

Discussion points

- What do you discover about Victoria's reasons for being in Berlin? How does this affect the decisions she makes throughout the course of the film?
- Why do you think the filmmaker chose to have characters speak in different languages? How does this shape the formation of their relationships?
- How does the music affect the mood of the film and reflect the action on-screen? What role does music play in the film?
- How do you think the tight timeline drives the structure of the plot? Do you think the film would be as effective without the use of the single take?

Write about it

Extension Activities
